

2022 Contract Changes Summary

Non-BlueEdge_{SM} with Select Formulary moving to Non-BlueEdge_{SM} to ResultsRx Formulary

Changes are effective at anniversary unless otherwise indicated

ACA Preventive Change – Colorectal screening for cancer now covered from age 45 to 75 years of age. Previously covered from 50 to 75 years of age.

Handicapped Dependent Children – Change requests must be received within 60 days rather than 63 days.

Prescription drug program

Insulin Drugs – Subject to the brand copay.

Drug Supply Limit – The benefit for prescription drugs supply limit has changed from 34 days to a 30-day supply (90-day for mail order).

Maintenance List – There is no maintenance list, but members will have access to the Extended Supply Network, which allows them to purchase up to a 90-day supply of drugs at a retail pharmacy for additional copays.

Formulary – The list of preferred medication is subject to change periodically. Members can obtain the most accurate prescription drug coverage by selecting the BCBSKS ResultsRx Medication List at bcbsks.com/drugs.

Diabetic Supplies – Continuous Glucose Monitor added to the list of diabetic supplies.

Prescription Drug Supply Refill/Reissue – Prescription refill available after 75% depletion on mail order for controlled and non-controlled substances. Prescription refill available after 75% depletion for non-controlled substances or 85% depletion for controlled substances at retail pharmacy. Change from 2/3 of previously issued supply was exhausted.

Generic Mandatory – Generic medications are mandatory unless the prescription practitioner has provided the override to receive the brand name drug. If the member does not have the doctor override, the member is responsible for any cost difference above the copay. For any prescription drugs included on Narrow Therapeutic Index, the member can receive the brand name drug and will not be charged for the cost difference between brand and generic.

Self-Administered IV Drugs – Coverage for certain self-administered IV drugs including hemophilia drugs will be covered under the pharmacy benefit.
